Policy Statement

UTAX (UK) Ltd (the "Company") is committed to driving out acts of modern-day slavery and human trafficking within our supply chain or any part of our business.

The policies we have in place and this anti-slavery statement, reflect our commitment to:

Employees

- Undertake regular training on Modern Slavery awareness.

Suppliers/Partners

The Company performs due diligence checks on all suppliers and partners, including regarding modern slavery and human trafficking. The Company will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in modern slavery or human trafficking.

The Senior Management Team shall take responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives and shall provide adequate resources and investment to ensure that modern slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the Company and within its supply chain.

Breaches

All persons are encouraged to raise concerns about any issue or suspicion of modern slavery in any parts of the company or its supply chains, via the contact details below.

Any employee suspected of breaching this policy will be investigated and may be subject to disciplinary action which could result in dismissal for misconduct or gross misconduct. Relationships with other individuals and companies working on our behalf will be terminated if they breach this policy statement.

Suspicions of a breach in criminal activity relating to a breach in modern slavery legislation will be reported to the applicable UK governing body or authority.

Monitoring

This policy will be reviewed regularly to ensure accuracy and effectiveness.
